



TEACHERS NOTES

Audience for the game:

It was designed to meet the needs of a P3 class of EAL children working with stage 1 of English.

Purpose of the game:

of EAL children consolidate their knowledge of the fairytales I had read in class. The stories covered are: Goldilocks and The Three Bears, The Some of the children had never heard of the fairytales common to other children in the class. This game was designed to help a small group Three Billy Goats Gruff, The Three Little Pigs and Little Red Riding Hood.

How to use this game:

Print off rules and game board in one colour. Print out playing cards in two different colours


YOU NEED:

A white 'fairytale three in a row board' One set of red and blue playing cards

HOW TO PLAY:

Each player takes a set of cards (one red and one blue) Put the cards face down in front of you. Take it in turns to pick a card. Look at what fairytale is written on it, try to find something on the board connected with that fairytale (it may be a character, setting or words from the story). Once you have found something, put your card down on that space.

The first person to get three of their cards in a row wins.
