Parking in Middlesbrough

Middlesbrough Council has FREE parking for 2 hours in some of the Council operated car parking sites, 7 days per week. The Council allows free parking for Blue Badge holders not just in disabled bays.

Blue Badge Scheme

The National Blue Badge scheme offers parking provision for a disabled person travelling as either the driver or passenger. The Council allows free parking without time limits for holders of Blue Badges including long and short stay sites. There is a £10 charge for the badge, which lasts for 3 years. Concessionary Travel Scheme

Qualifying older people or people with a disability (18+) can apply for a bus pass. Before 9.30am bus pass holders pay a lower fixed fare for any journey. Bus pass holders can travel free of charge after 9:30am weekdays and anytime on weekends. You can complete an online application on the Council website. Dementia Friendly Parking Bays are available in the Hill Street Centre. the bays display the Dementia Friends forget-me-not logo \Rightarrow and are wider than normal bays, to make it easier for those living with dementia and their Carers to go to the centre.
