The Council of the Borough of Middlesbrough, in exercise of its powers under 82(2), 83(2) and Section 84 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. This Order shall come into force on the 6th March 2023 and shall be cited as the Council of the Borough of Middlesbrough (Various Locations) 20 mph Speed Limit Order 2023.
- 2. No person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 20mph on the lengths of road as set out in the Schedule hereto.
- 3. Exemptions to Article 2 above will be permitted for vehicles used in connection with the emergency services.




